Bubbles

"Find what's fun" (Motivation/Child interest)

- Look at your child
- What do they want to do?
- What do they like about bubbles?

"What's this all about?" (Theme)

- Blowing bubbles
- Popping bubbles

"You could say" (Narration)

- 'pop', 'blow', 'big' 'up'
- 'oh no!'
- 'look bubbles'
- 'it popped'

"Copy me" "Do what I do and say what I say" (Sharing Play)

- Copy the child's actions
- Eg. blow, pop, clap, point, run, wave

- Stomp on the bubbles
- Clap the bubbles
- Blow bubbles up/down
- Blow bubbles in water
- Blow bubbles on objects, furniture, people

SpinAgain

"Find what's fun" (Motivation/Child interest)

- Look at your child
- What do they want to do?
- What do they like about the "SpinAgain" toy?

"What's this all about?" (Theme)

- Stacking gears
- Putting on / taking off
- Watching the gears spin down

"You could say"

(Narration)

- 'on'
- 'off'
- 'spin'
- 'red', 'blue', 'yellow', etc.
- 'go'
- 'stop'

"Copy me" "Do what I do and say what I say" (Sharing Play)

- Copy the child's actions
- Eg. put gears on the stick and take them off

- Roll gears
- Put in water, sand, rice
- Spin gears on your fingers
- Bang the gears together
- Race the gears across the floor

Playdough

"Find what's fun" (Motivation/Child interest)

- Look at your child
- What do they want to do?
- What do they like about playdough?

"What's this all about?"

(Theme)

- Exploring
- Making things

"You could say"

(Narration)

- 'roll', 'cut', 'squish', 'red', blue', green' etc. 'ball'
- 'it's a snake'
- 'look a triangle'
- 'it's soft'

"Copy me" "Do what I do and say what I say" (Sharing Play)

 Copy the child's actions as they explore the playdough

- Add popsicle sticks
- Use cookie cutters and plastic utensils to cut the playdough
- Squish in pasta
- Add play dishes
- Sprinkle with cinnamon or cocoa

Balloons

"Find what's fun" (Motivation/Child interest)

- Look at your child
- What do they want to do?
- What do they like about balloons?

"What's this all about?"

(Theme)

- Blow it up
- Let it go
- Tie a knot at the end
- Bay the balloon around in the air

"You could say"

(Narration)

- 'pop', 'blow', 'big' 'up'
- Bigger/smaller
- Colour names
- bang'/'tap'

"Copy me" "Do what I do and say what I say" (Sharing Play)

- Copy the child's actions
- Eg. blow up the balloon, go find the balloon, bat it in the air

- Draw faces on the balloons
- Use water balloons
- Try balloon animals
- Add flour inside the balloon to make it feel squishy
- Rub the balloon on your head to make static and so it will stick
- Throw the balloon into a target/basket

Pound a Ball

"Find what's fun" (Motivation/Child interest)

- Look at your child
- What do they want to do?
- What do they like about the "Pound a Ball" toy?

"What's this all about?" (Theme)

- Put the balls in the slots
- Hammer the balls
- Watch the balls drop

"You could say"

(Narration)

- on', 'bang', 'hammer', 'ball'
- '1-2-3-4'
- 'go down'

"Copy me" "Do what I do and say what I say" (Sharing Play)

- Copy the child's actions as they explore "Pound a Ball"
- Eg. put a ball in a slot, hammer the ball with the mallet

- Catch balls
- Roll balls
- Shake balls or bang them together
- Push the balls back up the ramp
- Hit the ball with the hammer like a hockey stick or croquet mallet

Books

"Find what's fun" (Motivation/Child interest)

- Look at your child
- What do they want to do?
- What do they like about books?

"What's this all about?" (Theme)

- Sit together
- Explore the book's cover and pages
- Point out pictures and print

"You could say" (Narration)

- Words from the book
- Comment and label what you see: odjects, people, places and actions
- Use words that are specific to the child's interests

"Copy me" "Do what I do and say what I say" (Sharing Play)

- Copy the child's actions
- Do what the child does with the book (i.e. pointing, turning pages)

- Bring items from 'real life' into book reading (ie. objects, figurines, stuffed animals)
- Use books that your child can touch
- Look at books that light up or make noise
- Sing when reading the book
- Dress up and act out the story
- Read flyers, catalogues that may be of interest to your child
- Look at a photo album
- Create your own book
